PACT Act Update:

- Recent PACT Act Outreach events have been held at the Alliance in Sioux Falls this past April, two in June in Watertown and Aberdeen, and the Show and Shine Car Show on August 14.

Compact Act Update:

- Sioux Falls has had a total of 222 Veterans covered under the COMPACT ACT since it was rolled out in January. There are currently 53 Veterans who have an active episode.
- COMPACT ACT stands for Veterans Comprehensive Prevention, Access to Care and Treatment. It requires the (VA) to directly furnish, pay for, or reimburse for emergent suicide care (to include associated transportation costs) at VA and non-VA facilities for eligible individuals in acute suicide crisis.
- This includes:
 - o Up to 30 days of inpatient or crisis residential care
 - 90 days of outpatient care related to the acute suicide crisis (this period can be extended if deemed clinically necessary). This includes both medical care and mental health care.
 - Prescription medications
 - Emergency transportation (ambulance or air transport) that is related to the suicide crisis.

Million Veteran Program

- The Million Veteran program is the largest research program within the VA. The program looks to find better ways to treat prevent and detect illnesses using a combination of analytics and genetic research. We have over 1,000,000 veterans and are moving towards our next million.
- Joining the program is easy. The sign-up process takes about 20 minutes. After signing up, it is a one-time blood draw, and time it takes to complete the surveys. The surveys arrive on an average of once a year.

PACT ACT Updates

The PACT Act is a new law that expands VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic substances.

The PACT Act adds to the list of health conditions that we assume (or "presume") are caused by exposure to these substances. This law helps us provide generations of Veterans—and their survivors—with the care and benefits they've earned and deserve.

We can assist you in getting medical treatment and enhanced benefits by providing Toxic Exposure Screens with your Primary Care Team.

Toxic Exposure Screens (TES)

• Clinical reminders for Nurses and Providers are in place for the assessment of Veterans for their exposure to toxins. Toxic Exposure Screens are being offered through your Primary Care Team. TES is also being done in some Specialty Care areas as well and we continue to expand these screens into other areas of the healthcare delivery system.

• VABHHCS has screened over 16,165 Veterans with 40% endorsing at least 1 exposure concern. 76% of all VA Black Hills Veterans have been screened.

COMPACT ACT

What it is

- Any Veteran whether enrolled in VA or not can go to a VA or non-VA emergency room for emergent suicidal care.
- We strongly recommend Veterans in suicidal crisis call 911 or visit their nearest emergency room for expedited care.
- VA will provide the treatment or cover the costs for treatment including transportation, inpatient or crisis residential care for up to 30 days, and outpatient care for up to 90 days
 - VA Black Hills has assisted 142 Veterans with coverage under the COMPACT Act since implementation.

Care In the Community

VA provides care to Veterans through community providers when VA cannot provide the care needed. Community care is based on specific eligibility requirements, availability of VA care, and the needs and circumstances of individual Veterans.

- Black Hills has 1055 unscheduled consults. Lowest in the VISN.
- There are no unscheduled consults >30 days with no activity.
- No consults aged >180 days

Home Based Primary Care and Home Health

Home Based Primary Care is health care services provided to Veterans in their home. The program is for Veterans who need team based in-home support for ongoing diseases and illnesses that affect their health and daily activities.

Veterans usually have difficulty making and keeping clinic visits because of the severity of their illness and are often homebound, but that is not required.

This program is also for Veterans who are isolated, or their caregiver is experiencing a burden. Home Based Primary Care can be used in combination with other Home and Community-Based Services.

- VA medical staff including Physician Assistants, Registered Nurses, Dietitians, Occupational Therapists, Psychologists, and Pharmacists travel to the homes of Veterans in rural communities.
- 0% readmission rate for all veterans using home-based primary care at VA Black Hills.
- Reduced inpatient days by 84%.
- Reduced ER visits by 36.6%.
- Reduced ER readmissions by 44%.
- Currently serving 312 Veterans in the Community. (Up from 183 in Jan. 24)

BTSSS Backlog is at 213. The oldest claim in review is less than 12 days from the date the claim was submitted. Addressing the backlog currently.

PACT Act

Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act of 2022 (PACT) has been signed by the President adding 20 toxic exposure related condition to the presumptive list of Veterans and Survivors.

- Empower VA to deliver benefits to Veterans living with more than 20 toxic exposurerelated conditions and to their survivors.
- Make generations of Veterans eligible for VA health care, while increasing care for many more.
- Ensure that every enrolled Veteran receives an initial toxic exposure screening at VA and follow-up screening at least every 5 years.
- Increase VA research on toxic exposure; and
- Give VA tools to hire and retain employees and modernize over 30 facilities.

VBA has completed 1.6 million + PACT Act Claims; of those 5,608 were for South Dakota Veterans.

Cancer claims are being prioritized for processing due to the potential for terminal illness.

Conditions included as presumptive for PACT for toxic airborne exposures:

VBA recently processed there 1 millionth PACT Act Claim.

VBA Veteran Readiness and Employment Services

Veterans may receive Veteran Readiness and Employment (VR&E) (Formerly known as Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment) services to help with job training, employment accommodations, resume development, and job seeking skills coaching. Other services may be provided to assist Veterans and Servicemembers in starting their own businesses or independent living services for those who are severely disabled and unable to work in traditional employment. Veterans/Servicemembers can visit the Regional Office in Sioux Falls or visit the following website to learn more and apply for VR&E benefits: https://www.va.gov/careers-employment/vocational-rehabilitation/.

Current Regional Office Public Contact/Veterans Readiness and Employment Hours

Regional Office is opened from 8:00 am to 4:30 pm Monday through Friday, excluding Federal Holidays. Masks are not required when entering the Regional Office at this time.

Nationally, VBA has completed over 1.9 million claims; on par to exceed 2 million in FY24. Over 6.6 million Veterans compensation and pension benefits.

 U.S. Congressional Representative Liaison for Senator John Thune Appropriations: The Senate Appropriations Committee has approved 11 of 12 appropriations bills. The only appropriations bill left in limbo is Homeland Security – and that bill could see some action from the committee after the August recess.

The Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, and Related Agencies appropriations bill, which was approved by the committee in July, would include \$339.59 billion for the VA in total discretionary and mandatory funding — \$32.39 billion above current levels and \$77 million above President Biden's request. Discretionary funding for the VA would clock in at \$129.18 billion, which is \$5.59 billion below fiscal 2024 levels and \$77 million more than the president's budget request.

The VBA would receive \$241.16 billion for fiscal 2025 — \$23.91 billion more than fiscal year 2024. The Veterans Health Administration would receive \$132.32 billion for fiscal 2025, which is \$25.89 billion more than fiscal 2024 levels.

This title also includes \$112.59 billion for veterans' medical care — \$8.43 billion below enacted levels — along with \$495 million to the National Cemetery Administration and \$894 million to help implement the VA's electronic health record system.

The Senate is adjourned until September 9.
